

Catonsville College Awards Degrees To 29 Sunday In First Graduation At Campus

Dr. Wilson H. Elkins, president of the University of Maryland, will give the major address at the fifth commencement exercises of Catonsville Community College this Sunday, June 9, at 3 P.M. on the college's campus at 800 South Rolling road.

The commencement is the first to be held on the 105-acre campus purchased for the College by the Board of Education of Baltimore county last year. Weather permitting, the ceremony is scheduled for the lawn in front of the Mansion House.

Dr. Oliver H. Laine, president of Catonsville College, will introduce Dr. Elkins and will confer Associate in Arts degrees on 29 graduates. Ernest E. Wooden, chairman-emeritus of the Board of Education, will award the degrees.

Graduates are to be presented by Jesse Myers, chairman of the college mathematics department. Mrs. Ruth R. Rinehart, Dean of Student Personnel at Catonsville College will announce the honor students. Miss Carol Kirkley, vice-president of the Student Council, is scheduled to respond for the students.

The Rev. David Hicks MacPherson, minister of the Towson Unitarian-Universalist Church, will give the invocation. Benediction will be pronounced by Father Henry J. Hughes of St.

Mark's Catholic Church, Catonsville.

A specially organized eight-piece brass ensemble from the Catonsville Senior High orchestra, under the direction of Edward C. Wolf, is slated to play.
